

TIMPANY SCHOOL PREMIER LEAGUE (TSPL) 2025 INAUGURATION
















CELEBRATION OF HAR GHAR TIRANGA 2025-TSSS




Tricolour Popsicle Stick Activity

26 AUGUST, 2025

The LKG Children embarked on a fun and educational "Shiny Teeth Adventure," where they learned how to fight off "sugar bugs" and keep their teeth sparkling clean. The activity started with a short, age-appropriate discussion on why brushing teeth is essential. LKG - L for Leaf -TSSS

It was a fun and engaging way to introduce the letter 'L' and connect it with nature. Children were able to identify the letter 'L' and relate it to the word leaf. Leaf Printing helped the children to improve fine motor skills. Children showed great interest and excitement while touching and exploring real leaves.







Number Neighbours: What's Next? What's Before? 22 August, 2025

Our UKG children enthusiastically participated in an engaging hands-on activity to learn the concept of before, after, and between numbers. Each child was given a colourful number strip where they arranged and identified numbers in the correct order.

Through this activity, students learned how to:

- Recognise and place the number that comes before a given number.
- Identify the number that comes after a given number.
- Understand the concept of the number that comes between two numbers.

The activity not only helped in reinforcing number sequencing but also made learning fun and interactive. Children enjoyed holding their number strips proudly and shared their answers with classmates. This activity boosted their observation skills, logical thinking, and number sense. It was indeed a joyful and meaningful learning experience for our little learners!



Spinning into Science – Twirl & Turn Windmill Fun

22 August, 2025

Class 1 students had a fun and creative windmill activity at school. The students created a working paper windmill (or pinwheel) that introduced them to the concept of wind energy, motion, and basic engineering - all while having fun and being creative! They learned how wind helps in making things move. The activity sparked curiosity about wind energy. It was a joyful and educational experience for everyone.

They develop a better sense of left and right as well as spatial awareness. They developed Fine Motor Skills, Focus and concentration, Visual perception, and problem-solving.

NATIONAL LIBRARIANS DAY-TSSS




TELUGU DIWAS


ELOCUTION COMPETITION-TSSS


